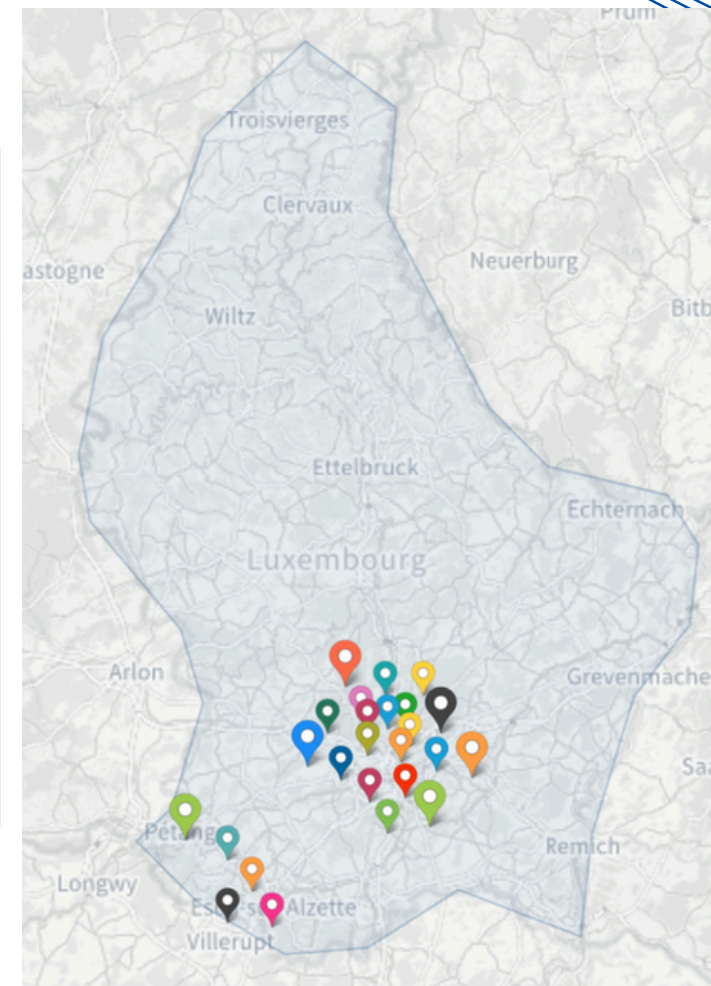

EMA Country Representatives (CRs) are EMA volunteers who have been selected as country representatives. There is usually one, and in some cases two or maximum three official EMA CRs per country. EMA CRs have a direct mandate to represent EMA in their on-duty country. They guide Erasmus Mundus prospects, students and alumni to make the most out of the experience on its different stages. Furthermore, they are the main point of contact between EMA and Erasmus Mundus prospects, alumni and students coming from the country they represent.

What is a voluntary service?

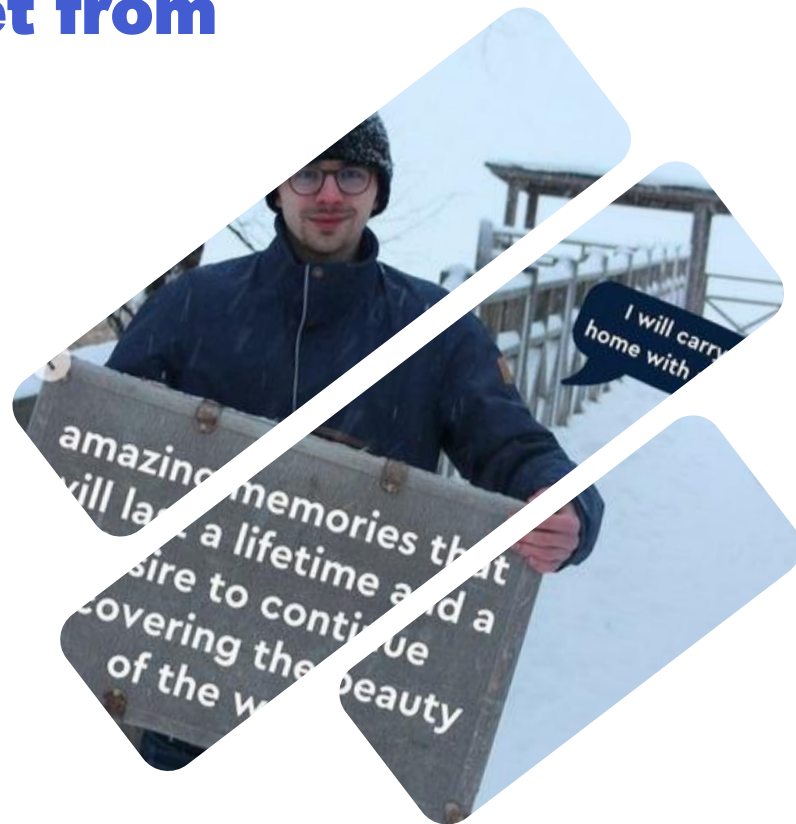
An offer for young people between 16 and 30 years

Commitment to a specific project of public interest

It is an opportunity to learn through practical experience, develop new skills and orientate yourself

What benefits do you get from volunteering?

- Strengthen your skills
- Gain new experiences, meet new people
- Explore different sectors
- Enhance your opportunities (CV, labour market, school, university, training)
- The status of a volunteer is legally regulated
- You can contribute your ideas to a mission
- You can learn to take responsibility for your project and actions



Role of the SNJ



- Compliance with the law on voluntary service
- Evaluation of organizations and missions
- Management of subsidies
- Training of partners and volunteers
- Information and mediation
- Support and assistance in administrative procedures



Possibilities and requirements

What are the conditions?

- You must have completed compulsory schooling
- The age limit is 30 years on the day you start your mission
- You need to have **legal residence in Luxembourg**

Support and finances

- Support in the form of an **allowance or pocket money and meal allowance**.
- Affiliation with **health insurance, pension schemes, and accident insurance**.
- **Financial aid from the state** if residence conditions are met.

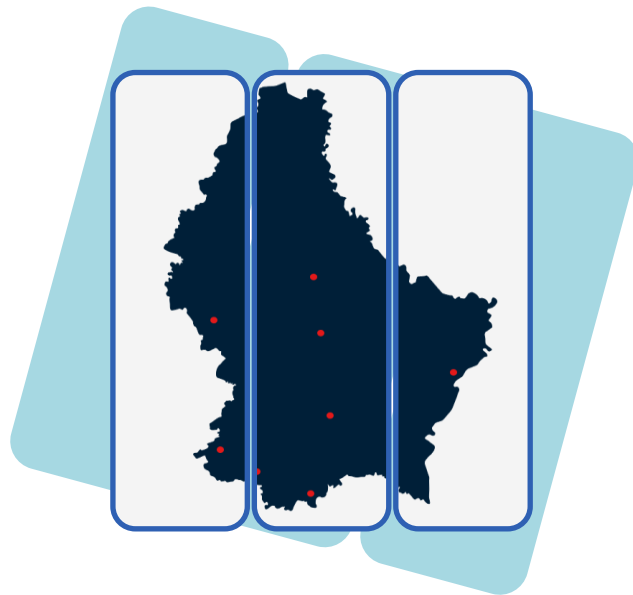


